This Award is suitable for adult learners who are already working in a childcare setting or who aspire to do so. It is designed to enable participants to work in a professional capacity with children aged between 0 and 3 years within a childcare centre. This award provides the skills, knowledge and understanding required for one to work effectively within a childcare environment while maintaining appropriate self-care throughout one's career as per national occupational standards in childcare.
